Reconnection Curriculum Statement

(March 2021 - July 2021)

Following partial school closures during the third National Lockdown, it is necessary to make temporary changes to our curriculum to meet both the learning and the social needs of our children.

The aims of our Reconnection Curriculum are:

- To allow children to reconnect with their learning.
- To allow children to re-establish relationships with their peers.
- To support children's health and well-being.
- To identify and fill gaps in children's learning.

Main Changes

1. Big Read. This will now take every morning as opposed to four; it will allow teachers more time to read aloud to the class, nurture the love of reading and motivate children to read independently from the class library.
2. Timetable Change. Maths will now be taught before break instead of after break as this is the area where attainment is not as high. Children are able to focus better earlier in the day.
3. IT. Thirty new laptops were purchased during lockdown to allow more children to access devices and build on the skills they acquired during remote learning.
4. PE. During lockdown, the site was mapped out for orienteering so taster sessions will take place during Spring 2 to further enhance outdoor learning.
5. Topics. The long term planning cycles have been re-arranged to support children's learning. See supporting documents.
6. Interventions. 1-1 and small group intervention for maths during the school day. English small group interventions after school.
